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**SEASON OF TRAMPS IS NOW ON**

The period of tramps is at hand. The approach of cold weather, in the east, the completion of the harvest in the Dakotas and Minnesota, combine to drive the mid-western hobo to the coast. Consequently the Pacific coast will be flooded with Weary Willies for the coming few months. The migration was noticeable last evening. Passenger number 5 brought in its quota of tramps, at least five climbing off the "blind" and rods. The Grande Ronde valley's thrift and pleasant environment seemed to have reached the ears of the tramp world too. Even from the west last evening, five tramps arrived. The police of the city was hurried to the limit to arrest and hurry out of town, the vagrants. Seven arrests had been made by 2 o'clock. At that hour the district around the freight cars and depot contained several skulking forms. Life for the hobo is hard in this city and this morning there has been a general clean up. The tramp nuisance has wrinkled the brow of a larger police force than ours, and property and citizens of La Grande should be protected by a larger force than the present one.

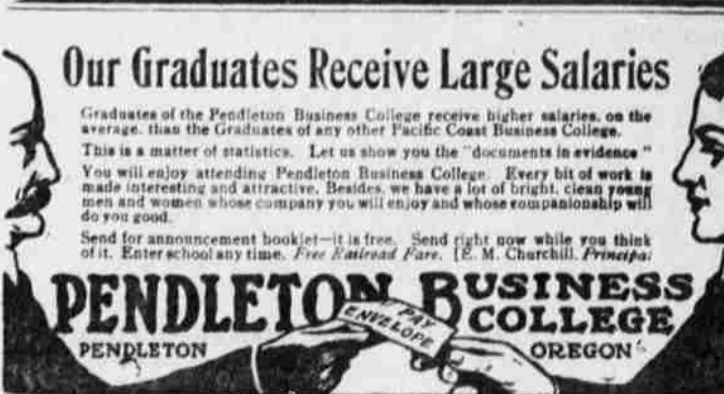
