## AMERICAN BANKERS IN CONVENTION

(Scripta News Association)

St. Louis, Miss., Oct. 16.—The thirty second annual convention of the American Bankers' Association was held here today. The attendance was larger than at any previous convention of the Association. There were addresses of welcome by Hon. David R. Francis, president trans-Mississippi congress; Hon. J. W. Falk, governor of Missouri; Hon. Rollo Wells, mayor of St. Louis; and J. C. Van Blarcom, president of the National Bank of Commerce in St. Louis. The Hon. Chas. Fowler read a paper on "Pending financial legislation" and Mr. John Knight secretary of the Canadian Bankers Association, spoke on "Our currency as it appears to a Canadian." On tomorrow a general discussion on practical banking questions will take place and one of the features of the third days' session will be an address by Mrs. Wm. F. Church, cashier of the bank at Joplin, Mo., on "A woman's qualification as a bank official." An elaborate program has been prepared by the reception committee for the entertainment of the delegates and guests. On Thursday evening a banquet will be given the general officials and council at the St. Louis club.
