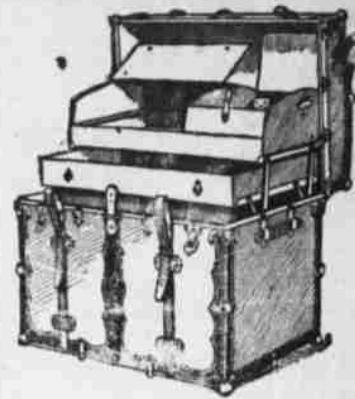

West, of Minneapolis as saying:

"It would be difficult to convince people
of the East and Middle West of the

coast cities. Mining and lumbering have
increased so rapidly that only the railroad
companies can comprehend.

has been the most important and will
continue so, yet the area of coarse grains
oats, barley, rye and hay is increasing
more as local demand for these is more
urgent. This proves the wonderful growth
of their cities and increase of animal
industry."

The Peck Idaho Sun, in speaking of the
railway surveyors at work there says:

The presence of this party of engineers
has caused much interest and specula-
tion. It is known that other parties are
now working along the south side of the
Clearwater one being stationed at Spaulding
and another, it is reported in the vicin-
ity of Lamora. One view is that the
Harriman interests are preparing to build
over their old right of way from Lewiston,
via Peck to Camas prairie where an
intersection will be made with the "Pla"
road now building northward from Council
and that this end of the road will be allied
with the Milwaukee. How such an ar-
rangement would effect the joint con-
struction plans of the Oregon road and
the Northern Pacific from Riparia is not
clear. Another view is that Harriman is
simply running this survey for
statistical reasons tho to what
end nobody knows.

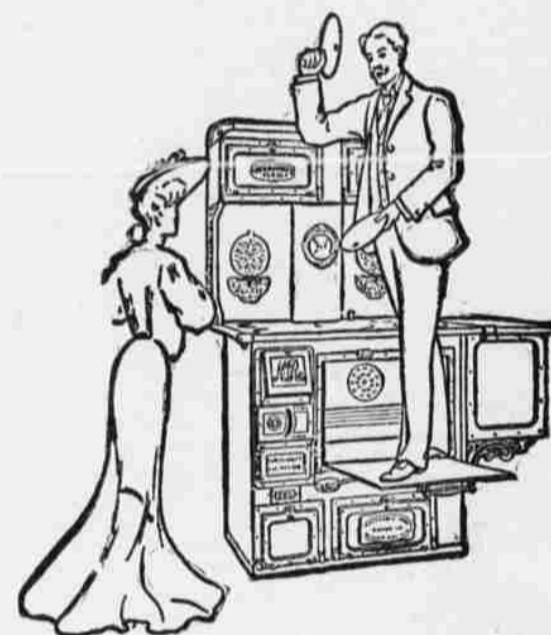
