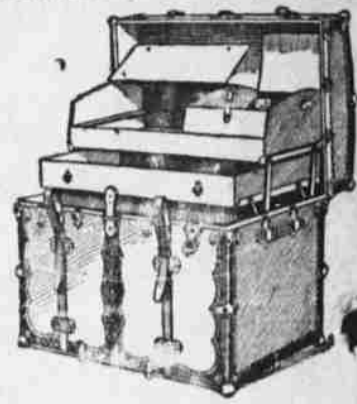

La Grande is well represented at the county teachers institute which is being held at Union today.

The labor question is something without precedent in this city. It is almost out of the question to get help. There is hardly an enterprise in the city but what is running short-handed.

The fruit men, the best and potato growers are the ones now in the market for extra help. It is one continual harvest in Grande Ronde Valley from June 15th when haying commences until December 1st.

The cool nights have the effect of starting the fall trade. Our merchants are all prepared with unusually large stocks and there never was the assortment to select from as is now being displayed by the La Grande merchants.

Contractor Geo. Kreiger, who has been running the brick yard in this city for a number of years stated today that this year had been a record breaker for his business and that he was certain that there would be a great deal more building in La Grande next year than this. This sane assurance is expressed by every contractor in the city.

The Quaker Oats cereal company of Iowa a few days ago purchased three thousands bushels of wheat in Umatilla county. The day is not far distant when capital will recognize the superiority of the wheat grown in the Inland Empire and will establish a large plant in the center of the wheat belt. La Grande with her cheap power and superior wheat would be an ideal location for such an industry.

The vitals of the United States' crack war vessels are declared to be filled with boiler tubes that were rejected by the government inspectors, according to charges against Pittsburg concerns. The United States government, thru the department of justice is investigating charges that defective boiler flues were supplied by the Shelby Steel Tube company for the new warships, Maine, Colorado, Georgia and Pennsylvania. That government stamps were stolen and used to get defective flues past the inspectors and that cars, after being sealed by the government, were opened and defective tubes added to complete shipments. The warships directly involved in the charges, and which cost \$14,505,000 are the new battleships Maine and Georgia, and the armored cruisers Colorado and Pennsylvania.

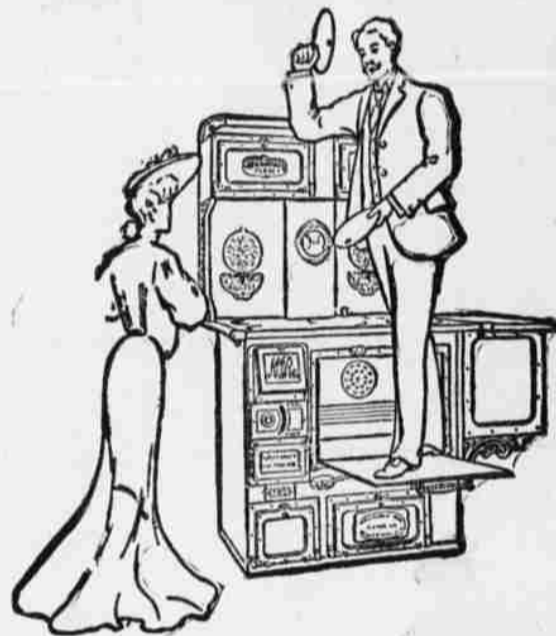
