 Eugene, Oregon Oct. 27—The second team of the University met the Eugene High School team today on the college gridiron. The college boys felt good over the news from Moscow and proceeded to show the Highs how to play the game. The final score was 27 to 0 in favor of the scrubs. Coykendall made a place kick goal, Steiwer carried the ball over the line once, and Hathaway made three touchdowns by long end runs. Hurd at full and Hawley at half showed that they are varsity material. Groat played center against a 200 pound man and demonstrated the quality of Grande Ronde lads by blocking bunts repeatedly and more than once tackling high school men behind their own scrimmage line. The line-up of the college boys follows: Ends Steiwer and Erskine; tackles, Pinkham and Williams; guards, Wilson and Kilpatrick; center, Groat; quarter, Coykendall; halves, Hawley and Hathaway; full-back, Hurd. Time of 40 minutes.
