LOCATORS STAND IN LINE

Redding, Cal. Oct. 30.—The rush near the United States land office to get into line to locate on the 10,000 acres which will be subject to homesteads or timber claims in Shasta, Trinity, and Siskiyou Counties, grows every hour. Long lines of locators are waiting.
