We understand that the council committed which has the new charter amendments, has about completed its work and will have its report ready for the consideration of the council at the next regular meeting.

Consul J. M. Miller, of Rheims, reports that dogs have a commercial value in France. They are used for pulling small carts in delivering goods and for other purposes. In 1904 there were 4362 dogs, valued at \$168,573, imported into France; the average price per head was \$38.

The United States government finds that it will have to increase the salaries of the postal clerks or impaired efficiency in the handling and delivery of the mail in many large cities of the Middle and Northwest will result. The government is finding it difficult to get men to accept places as clerks for the salaries offered.

In consequence of the strong demand in Poland for manufactured goods which the local factories are unable to meet, owing to the strikes and their effects, the sale of foreign goods in Poland is reported by the British consular officer at Warsaw to have considerably increased of late. The demand is chiefly for paper, leather, and textiles, both materials and manufactures. Moreover, the terms are as a rule cash, which removes the difficulty of long credit, usual in Poland.

If betting is any criterion of the New York election it is worthy of note that at the present time there is only \$300,000 up on Wall Street as compared with \$1,000,000 last year on the mayorality. It means one of two things, that the contest on next Tuesday is considered so close that little money is offered or that the backers of Mr. Hearst are not covering the Hughes money. The solution of the problem will be made perfectly plain when the votes are counted.

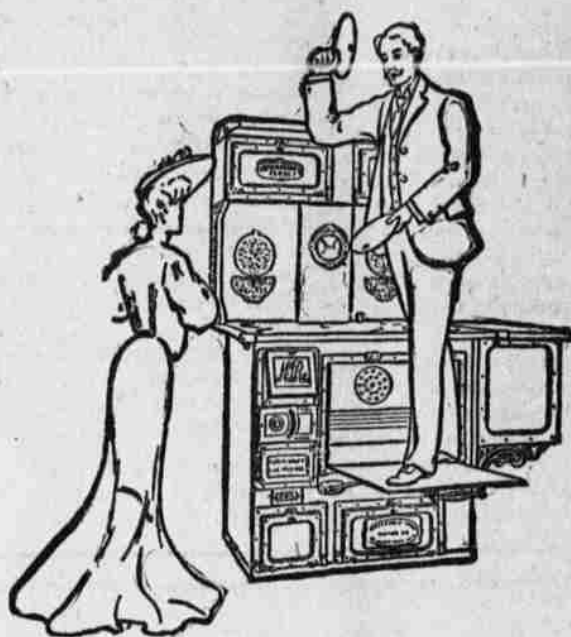
