## FULTON TO WORK FOR OREGON

Senator Fulton at the session of Congress this winter will introduce the following bills of vital interest to Oregon says the Telegram.

A bill appropriating \$2,000,000 for the erection of a new postoffice building at Portland, the present building to be used as a Federal office building.

Appropriating \$2,500,000 for completion of jetty construction at the mouth of the Columbia river, as recommended by Col. Roessler of the United States Engineers.

A bill providing for the creation of a separate Federal judicial district for Eastern Oregon, the dividing line to be the Cascade Mountains. This bill will be practically the same as that introduced by the late Senator Mitchell, and which passed the Senate, but died in the House.

Will introduce name of P. S. Malcolm for Collector of Customs at Portland, immediately upon convening of Congress. The Senator will leave for Washington tomorrow morning, to remain until next Spring.
