The vinegar factory shipped out a carload of their product yesterday to Sacramento, California, and today a car goes to Seattle. The rush of apples continues and they are obliged frequently to shut off the inflow on account of being crowded beyond their capacity.

**THE FARM BOY IN CITIES**

It is announced that the proper material has been discovered near Durkee for making Portland cement and a large plant will soon be constructed. Such an industry means much for Eastern Oregon. The demand for cement is growing all the time.

Very flattering reports come from La Grande on the success of the beet sugar plant. There are plenty of Lane county people who would take pleasure in buying Lane county sugar.—Eugene Register.

Congress meets next month, but until next March, Senator Fulton will be Oregon's only active representative, in either house. It will be gratifying when we once more have a full representation in both houses.

Thirty-four states hold their election tomorrow. As this is considered an off year, the results will effect national issues only, as they may effect the political status of the lower house of Congress, should the present Republican majority be materially reduced.

Whether or not the tip is well founded, it is reported that Governor Chamberlain will appoint Judge Eakin's successor on or before December 1, in order that the appointee may arrange his private matters before going on the bench. There was no intimation, however, as to who would be the recipient of the honor.

Mr. Bryan has not been in politics these many years for naught. At the last moment when he realized that Hearst is defeated he comes out strong and bold for him. Hearst's defeat will eliminate him for the presidential race and nothing remains for him to do but to support Bryan.

It will be only two months until Judge Robert Eakin will take his seat upon the supreme bench, which will leave a vacancy in our present school board, to be supplied. This is a very important position, and doubtless will receive due consideration from the board which will fill the vacancy. Whoever is chosen will serve him three and one half years.

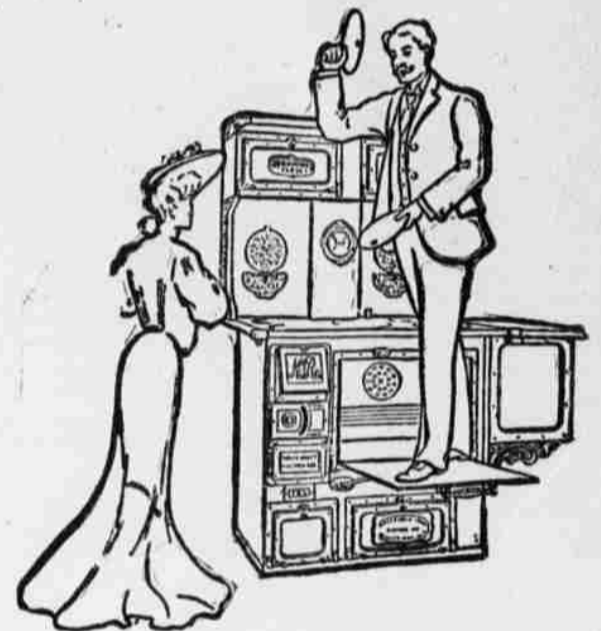
