CEMENT COMBINATION

The Geographical Survey in a bulletin states that there is a noticeable concentration of interests in the cement industry, and that this probably will become marked year by year. The 88 plants in existence in 1905 were owned by 28 companies and several of these nominally independent companies are closely connected by ownership. But it is stated that good raw materials are so widely distributed in the United States that there is hardly a county which could not produce Portland cement if prices were forced high enough. The only limitation now on the erection of cement plants is the fact that the great cost makes the venture prohibitive for the individual or for the small firm. The cement industry is at present in a more concentrated condition than was the iron and steel industry at the date of the formation of the United States Steel Corporation. The total authorized capital of all the American Portland cement companies now in operation will fall between the limits of \$110,000,000 and \$125,000,000. The bulletin states that this capitalization can not be considered excessive in view of the fact that it would cost probably from \$75,000,000 to \$85,000,000 to replace the plants now in existence.

The greatest activity is noted in the organization of new electrical works in Japan. Japan has a wonderful amount of water power, and this is rapidly being utilized for electrical purposes. No less than 51 new companies have been organized, with an aggregate capital stock

During the week ending Wednesday, Oct. 31, at 5 p. m., applications were filed with the Board of Public Works for permits to erect buildings in San Francisco aggregating \$2,190,000 in value.

The charges announced in the president's cabinet do not involve the department of the Interior. Secretary Hitchcock is retained in this important department, altho a stronger effort has been made against him than against all the other members of the cabinet combined.

The declared exports from Toronto Canada, to the United States for the last six months of 1905, writes Consul R. S. Chilton, Jr., amounted to \$1,664,932. The principal articles were crude gum chicle, valued at \$231,765; hides, \$176,742; tea, \$156,075; seeds, \$137,170; paper stock, \$80,717; wool, \$76,392; emigrants' effects, \$76,007; lambs, \$66,984; fertilizer, \$57,446, and tobacco, \$36,516.
