MANY DEER KILLED

The deer season, which has just closed was the most successful for the big game hunters of Oregon, of any enjoyed for years. It is estimated that fully 1000 deer were killed in the mountains of Josephine county alone.

In one district alone some 200 deer were killed. They are far more plentiful this season than they have been for many years. There is an abundance of feed and all the deer killed were in prime condition.

Hunters believe that the continued enforcement of the game law will result in the continuation of the present abundant big game supply for many years, before the mountain sections of southern Oregon are thickly settled.
