PNEUMONIA **YIELDS** TREATMENT

CONCESSION OF SCIENTISTS VERIFIES OS-TEOPATHIC THEORY .- THE GERM ONLY AN AUXILIARY CAUSE AND OSTEOPATHY FINDS AND CORRECTS THE ORIGINAL
