In spite of the disagreeable weather, a good sized crowd greeted Bishop Charles Scadding in the St. Peter's church last evening.  
 Misses Lycece Wood and Wyle Dalton were confirmed and taken into the church by the Bishop.

**CONTRACTOR MARS MAKES  
 PROPERTY TRANSFERS**

It seems that Contractor J.L. Mars and ex-real estate dealer can't refrain from killing birds out of season, judging from what he has accomplished during the past few months. He purchased fifteen lots himself and it seems he has a special eye on property suitable for warehouse purposes. As agent he sold lots 2-3, block 108, owned by Chas. G. Bunte for 2,800 and lot 1, in the same block owned by W. R. Hamilton, for \$5,600 to Julius Roesch. This property is now being excavated for a two story building 90x110, the first floor and basement to be occupied by one store and the upper floor to be cut up in rooms. The estimated cost of this building is \$35,000.  
 Mr. Mars recently sold lots 7 to 13, block, 151, from Chapman to G. E. Fowler for \$600 with expectation of having three residences built on them.

He also sold lots 15-16-17, block 121 the property of Mr. Fowler to Julius Roesch for \$1,200 who expects to build a large warehouse 92x110 feet for his own use. Also 1 1/2 lots in block 121 to John Palmer with a two story building for \$2,225.  
 It seems that in making these several trades he has killed two birds with one stone regardless of the game laws, but as he has always been a law abiding citizen, we will let him go on "killing as many birds as possible with as few stones as possible and if the game warden interferes it is doubtful if he could secure a jury that would convict him.
