MEACHAM DEPOT

The O. R. & N. Company has purchased a piece of land at Meacham from A. H. Todd, and will use the same for a depot site. The deal for the land was made here yesterday between Mr. Todd and J. B. Eddy, right of way agent for the company, \$100 per acre being paid, says the Pendleton E. O.

The tract purchased is about a quarter of a mile south of the present depot at Meacham. It lies on the east side of the track, and the new depot will be erected at once. On the opposite side a water tank will be built. The reason for the change in the depot location is to secure more side track room.
