# TO PREVENT FURTHER AMERICAN PURCHASES

London, Nov. 16—It was announced in Art circles here today that a conference of the heads of different art galleries was being arranged, the object being to take steps to prevent the further sale of art treasures to America. Privy Counsellor Bose, Director of the Royal Museum in Berlin who is the investigator of the project has written to the heads of all galleries in Europe begging them to do all in their power to rouse public opinion on the subject and the further suggests that it should that each government should be placed in possession of large sums of

money to buy up art treasures as they are put on market. He also suggests that it should be made a penal offense to sell certain classes of art objects to any buyer except to the state or someone appointed by the state. The directors of the National Gallery, here recently said that from England, Italy, France and Spain an extremely large number of bronzes, marbles, pictures and articles of vertax were being shipped to America during the past few years and unless something was done but the European National galleries would be left.

European manufacturers secure the bulk of the business in Mexico in galvanized iron and cement.

Canada is commercially invading Mexico in many lines, the latest of which is in cartridges and ammunition. The Canadian manufacturers claim equal quality and lower prices.

It is claimed by grocery men in this district that asparagus is being imported from France in large packages, and canned in the City of Mexico under American labels as if coming from San Francisco, Cal.

There is a great opening in Mexico for manufacturers of high-grade ready-made clothing.

Fresh apples are being imported into Mexico from British Columbia by several of the fruit dealers of Torreon with good results. These apples come thru the United States in bond, and the cost price, when received here, is about the same as for the Northern apples, but it is claimed that altho the apple is not as fine looking as the American, the flavor is superior.
