## OUR NEW BATTLESHIP

(Scripps News Association)  
Washington, Nov. 17—It would be safe to say that the battleship about to be built by the United States government, as a stand-off to the British Monster Dreadnought, will be 20,000 tons displacement, and will be capable of the carriage of ten twelve inch guns. Prominent persons in the navy department favor a vessel with sixteen five inch guns if they could be so fitted so as to protect torpedo attack both astern and ahead. It is stated that five designs are being considered. A prominent naval expert

has stated "We shall build a good and strong vessel, one that shall be an honor and a source of protection to our country but until the plan is finally selected shall be submitted to Congress very little of its design will be known to the outside world. Japan has commenced the building of two vessels, which will undoubtedly be equal if not superior to the Dreadnought, and we shall have to see the raise of the Japs and go one or two better, or be left out in the cold, as regards naval preparedness." The construction price must not exceed \$6,000,000.

## MONSTER GAME RESERVE

St. Johns, Nov. 17—One of the largest game preserves which has ever existed is that which New Brunswick Fish and Game Club proposed to form. It covers 1,700,000 acres. Considering the great attention which has lately been directed to Hudson Bay territories, this hunting ground when thrown open, will

be sure to attract a large number of English sportsmen. It is the property of the New Brunswick Railway Co., granted to it thirty-five years ago, since when it has remained untitled and intaxed.

The Provincial Government is alarmed at the idea of this immense area monopolized for sport, and every effort will be made to prevent it.

## RUBBER IS MADE OF WHEAT

(Scripps News Association)  
London, Nov. 17—A syndicate of tire manufacturers today acquired the patent rights of Arthur Carr, of Middlesex, for the manufacture of artificial rubber. It is stated Carr received \$1,250,000 for this invention. Carr has made artificial rubber from wheat, corn etc. for use as bicycle and automobile tires which has stood all practical tests. The new syndicate announced today that six grades of artificial rubber would be made from a liquid solution suitable for waterproofing to a hardness available for golf balls. In the latter the substance is credited with the lightness of cork and the toughness of steel. The other grades will be used for tires, tubes, linoleum and slabs or sheets for pavements. It is stated that the artificial rubber is obtained by treating any cereal with phyalin.
