A NEW RECORD IN RAILS

(Scripps News Association)
Philadelphia, Pa. Nov. 17.—All previous existing records in the production of steel rails in this or any other country have been broken during the past month in this state. One furnace at Sharon turned out 128,134 tons alone and the Clairton works of the Carnegie Steel Company have again broken ingots making 68,000 last month as against 53,000 in any other month since the furnaces were started. The Clairton plant consists of 12 open hearth furnaces of 60 tons capacity. One of these furnaces is on acid steel, and natural gas is used making it possible to run all the furnaces uninterruptedly during the month.

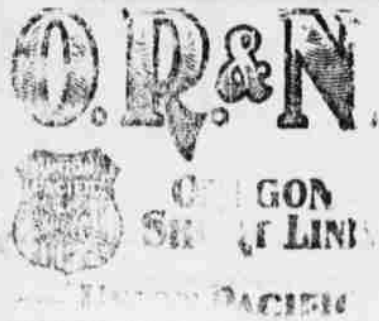
