The Register reports that the Ingham vinegar factory at Eugene, Oregon, is receiving an enormous quantity of apples this fall. It pays \$5 per ton for apples delivered at the factory.

Edison, the great inventor, promises within six months to supply the world with a storage battery at a cost of not over \$200 that will enable its owner to travel without further cost any distance for fifteen years.

The most extensively spoken language is Chinese, but as there are so many dialects in the language, and as these differ so greatly in the confines of Mongolia and Tibet from those around Peking, it is scarcely correct to say that the 382,000,000 Celestials all speak one language. Putting, therefore, China aside, the most spoken languages in the world are as follows, in millions: English, 120; German, 70; Russian, 68.

Exports from the United States in the nine months ending September 30 increased, as compared with the like period of last year, by \$135,774,902. The increase in the export of manufactured articles was \$35,468,855. The gain in imports was \$76,054,032, of which \$33,311,902 was in articles partly manufactured and \$40,061,638 in finished articles.

MASON AND DIXON'S LINE

Many persons are of the opinion that Mason and Dixon's line was the line of separation between the slave and the free states. And it must be admitted that the utterances of political orators have tended in a general way to create or uphold such belief. The fact is, however, that the demarcation between the north and south, so far as slavery was concerned, was the parallel of 36 degrees 30 minutes, so settled by the Missouri compromise of 1820. Whereas Mason and Dixon's line was the parallel of 39 degrees 43 minutes and was established as the line of separation between the states of Pennsylvania and Maryland. It was drawn by two noted English surveyors, Charles Mason and Jeremiah Dixon, who began their work in 1763 and finished it in 1767. The line was marked at intervals of five miles by large stones, showing the arms of Lord Baltimore on one side and those of the Penn family on the other. Between these at intervals of one mile were set smaller stones, showing the letters M. and P.—the initials of the two states.
