NATIONAL RAILROAD MILEAGE

(Scripps News Association)
 New York, Nov. 19.—According to Poor's Manual Supplement issued today there are 217,341 miles of completed railroads in the United States, being a net increase over 1905 of 4716 miles. The capital stock represented amounts to \$6,741,955,822 and the bonded debt to \$7,425,261,901. The total liabilities of the lines, according to the same authority aggregate \$16,292,880,825, as against \$18,495,504,351 in 1904. The total revenue is figured at \$2,112,197,170, and the operating expenses \$1,368,549,574. The passengers numbered 745,446,841, and they were carried 26,906,420,668 miles.
