SMALL LUMBER CUT PREDICTED

 Bangor, Maine, Nov. 20—It is expected that the large lumber operators will greatly curtail their business in the Rish River district during the coming winter. Lumber officials estimate that the total cut on the coming season will not exceed 20,000,000 feet or half of last year.
