PACIFIC ROUTE

(Scripps News Association)
 Seattle, Nov. 21.—The new Grand Trunk Pacific across the continent thru Canada and the British possessions, when completed, will shorten the distance between New York and Yokohama 1500 miles over the San Francisco route, 500 over the Canadian Pacific route and fully as much over the Hill route. The new line will pass thru the great wheat growing regions of Manitoba, Assinabua and Alberta for about 1000 miles and will then enter the rich mineral regions of British Columbia. The Pacific terminal will be on the Skeena river where a city called Prince Rupert is being built. The road is being constructed with all possible despatch.

FIRE IN WALLA WALLA

Tuesday night fire broke out in the Walla Walla roller mill located on the Yellow Hawk, just east of the city cemetery, and within half an hour the entire structure was a pile smouldering embers, bent and twisted machinery and smoking rains. The structure, a three-story frame building, was insured at \$7000 but the loss is estimated at between \$20,000 and \$25,000. It was operated by Coyle & Campbell, who manufactured the "Satisfaction" brand of flour, and when the fire broke out contained 12,000 bushels wheat, 10,000 sacks of barley and 350 barrels of flour, all of which was a total loss.

SEVERAL CHURCHES TO MERGE

 Pittsburg, Pa., Nov. 21.—The movement to merge the Congregational, Methodist, Protestant and United Brethren churches into one body, is now almost an assured fact. The consolidation of the churches into one body, to be known as the United Church, will give the new organization a membership of about 1,250,000, and make it one of the strongest Protestant church bodies in the world.

 New York, Nov. 21.—Owing to the extensive adulteration of coffee shipped into this country from Porto Rico, as elicited by an investigation of the Department of Commerce and Labor at Washington, the New York Custom Authorities have been instructed to carefully examine all ships manifests. Inferior grades of coffee put in ships manifests are peas and beans, shipped from this country to Porto Rico have been reshipped from there to other countries and back to the United States as high grade Porto Rican coffee.
