Mrs. Walter Reed, the most popular and famous contralto in Oregon, assisted by the talented tenor, Arthur Alexander also of Portland, is soon to give a recital in this city, provided that the movement which has been set on foot by local musicians, proves successful. Several ladies who are active members of the Lyle Tuesday Musicales, have taken the responsibility upon themselves of bringing this talent to La Grande. In order to bring this talent here, a guarantee fund of one hundred dollars must be on hand, also sufficient money to pay the expense from Portland to La Grande, making all told about one hundred and seventy-five dollars.

Mrs. Mesdames A. L. Richardson, who studied under Mrs. Reed, Fred Shike, and J. J. Carr, are the promoters of this scheme, and to make it a certainty they will personally canvass the city to make certain the number of people that will buy tickets at 50, 75 and \$1.00. If enough tickets are promised to guarantee the required amount, a date will be decided upon and the recital will then be forthcoming.

This date will be sometime in the early part of December.

Mrs. Reed is a cultured talent, whose services are in great demand in Portland and other coast cities. Baker City and Pendleton have listened to her singing and the press was full of favorable comment. She was musically educated in Europe. Mr. Alexander is also a student of Paris' best teachers, and his tenor voice is extremely pleasing.

The ladies of this city who have interested themselves, will start their canvass tomorrow, regardless of wind and snow, and may their efforts prove fruitful. Should they meet with success, the date will be announced within a few days.
