house must be filed and indexed here. He has as his first deputy Frank Bramwell, whose knowledge and ability as an accountant, places him in a position to creditable do these things. To this office you will go when you want a county license; the county clerk is ex officio member of the board of equalization; he is clerk of the county and circuit courts.

Ed Wright is also a deputy clerk and is a competent assistant in this busy office. Miss Goodenough, is a very essential member of the office, and her skill as a stenographer is tried every day and she is never found wanting.

If you would spend a few minutes in this office it would surprise you, the varied and numerous documents kept here. For the asking, he will show you the hugh vault where papers of exceedingly great value and the books containing entries of incalculable importance, are put away for safe keeping. It is simply too big a task to properly outline the work this office has to oversee and the only way, is to sit in his private office and keep ears and eyes open. When you go away you will think, "How can he do it all?"
