ANNIVERSARY OF DEATH OF TWO IRISH HEROES

Dublin, Nov. 23.—Today is the thirty-ninth anniversary of the execution in Manchester of Allen, Larkin and O'Brien, known as the "Manchester Martyrs". In the south and west, public parades will be held tonight and patriotic speeches delivered. Up to a few years ago these parades were declared meetings of conspirators by government proclamations and large bodies of police and soldiers endeavored to prevent them, the result being that much blood was shed. The execution of Allen, Larkin and O'Brien was a dramatic episode, in the history of Ireland's struggle for freedom. On the 18th

of September, 1867, two Irish-Americans charged with political offences, were being conveyed in a van from the Manchester police court to the jail. A large body of men stopped the van, shot the horses, and released the prisoners. During the struggle, a policeman was accidentally wounded by a shot. His death sometime afterwards, enabled the authorities to get a charge of murder drawn up. Allen and O'Brien spoke eloquently from the dock. A man, named McGuire, was also sentenced to death, but the Home secretary unconditionally pardoned him, which suggests that some of the evidence upon which the convictions were obtained, was doubtful.

GREAT CATHEDRAL IN NEW YORK

New York, Nov. 12.—A movement is on foot to convert the "old first" church on Fifth Avenue between eleventh and twelfth streets into a great cathedral. Building is a historic one. The congregation which now worships in it was founded in 1716 and before many years it will celebrate its Bi-centennial. A memorial tablet in the building sets forth that "it was first erected in 1719 and was thoroughly repaired and built larger in 1748." The present structure was built early in the last century and is one of the finest specimens of ecclesiastical architecture in the country. Its style is perpendicular gothic. The main body of the building is a replica of the church of St. Saviour at Bath, England, which was built in 1518 while the tower is a copy of the famous Magdalen Tower at Oxford built in 1500. Several strips of ivy were brought a number of years ago from the structure at the great English University and the vine which grew from them now adorn the brownstone structure on Fifth Avenue. The "old first" has an important place in American history. In retaliation for the prominent part taken by some of its members in the struggle for independence the building was converted into a barracks and a riding school by the British Officers. One of its elders was General Alexander McDougall, who served with distinction in the patriot army. The church was instrumental in the Princeton University and Princeton Theological Seminary. It also founded many philanthropic societies, hospitals etc.

JAPANESE DISCOVER MINE

Van Couver, Nov. 25.—A number of Japanese diving in Queen Charlotte sound for abalone shells struck a mineral reef which they have now acquired and are working at great profit.

The discovery of the ore by the Japs is an interesting story. They were diving for the abalone shells which are extensively used in Japan and notice that the reef on which they were carrying out their operations were not ordinary rock but great reefs of mineral. One of the divers while in about six fathoms of water came across a large piece of pure yellow metal which he thought was gold but on bringing it to the surface found it was copper. They immediately went in the shell business and said nothing about their find until they got money enough to secure and work their claims. This they are now doing. Besides copper, quantities of iron ore in large quantities have been brot to the surface. Several Americans are now located on properties beside them.

EFFECT OF WHISKY UPON NEGRO LABOR

Jackson, Miss., Nov. 23.—In the county court house here today there was a full gathering of manufacturers and employers of labor for the purpose of discussing local labor conditions. The meeting was called by Messrs. W. B. Taylor, W. B. Gowdy and H. Clay Shaiky, managers of large manufacturing plants. After considerable discussion it was decided to take steps to stop the illicit sale of liquor in the city, and other forms of criminality which were demoralizing negro labor conditions. It was shown that there were hundreds of idle negroes in the city while the demand for laborers was so great, manufacturing and other concerns were losing heavily for want of hands.
