## ANCIENT CITY IS TO BE UNCOVERED

(Scripps News Association)  
Rome, Nov. 27.—Professor Charles Wadstein, curator of five arts in Kings College, Cambridge, England, arrived here today, and tomorrow will perfect an agreement with the government concerning the carrying out of his project for excavation of the ancient city of Herculaneum. Professor Wadstein's plans have been accepted by the government on condition that the part representative of the foreign countries in the work be only in the form of private contributions and that there be no foreign official interference. Prof Wadstein has secured the active cooperation of King Victor Emanuel, as president of his organization as well as that of Emperor William of Germany, King Edward and President Roosevelt. The excavation will be a gigantic enterprise. The work of digging up the ancient city was begun in the reign of King Charles III in 1738, and was continued under the direction of the Italian government in 1856. This excavation has always been attended with the greatest difficulty, as over the ruins of the ancient city there stands today the town of Resina, with 20,000 inhabitants.

## THE CROP OF SUGAR IN CUBA

Havana, Nov. 27.—The sugar crop which is now nearly fully matured promises to be a record one but great difficulty is being experienced by planters who are urging the necessity of making use of \$1,000,000 appropriated by the late Cuban Congress for the stimulation of immigration and point out that Cuba is suffering severely from the competition of other nations seeking immigration, especially the republic of South America and the United States and from the importation of labor to Panama. Today Governor Magon received a deputation of the planters who expressed grave fears that the present labor supply would be insufficient to handle the crop. Further conferences on the subject will be held, as Governor Magon has announced his intention of taking steps to induce immigration.
