A SON OF TOM SHARKEY

Is the distinction which Jim Sharkey, now lodged in the county jail awaiting the arrival of Sheriff Blakely of Willows county, claims. The alleged son of the notorious prize fighter, was captured by Sheriff Childers after a lengthy chase. The warrant for his arrest alleges horse stealing and several other thefts but following is what the son of a prizefighter told an Observer representative today:

"Oh I stole a cayuse all right, but how could you blame me? I hired out for a man from Joseph to go down the Snake river and herd cattle all winter. Instead of that he sent me thirty miles into the woods to feed the cattle and horses on the ranch there. The first morning there I tried to expectorate but the saliva crystallized before it hit the ground and my toes turned into icicles. I was scheduled for a week there, thirty miles from nowhere and could not see how to follow instructions for the frost. What did I do? Well I don't see how I was going to walk to Joseph thru the snow and cold, so I mounted a cayouse and rode out. The rest is easy. Yes I'll get about four years all right."

The actual status in the affair, according to authorities from Willows county, is that Sharkey went to the ranch and the next day returned, bringing with him the animal and all the clothes and jewelry in the ranch house. Arriving at Enterprise he sold the stolen horse and took wings for a warmer clime.

The alleged thief is full of humor that will out and his incessant string of fairy tales are more interesting than instructive.
