BAD BOSS IS ENEMY TO SOCIETY

 Chicago, Dec. 4.—The National Industrial Association was addressed today by J. W. Cleve who is president of the National Association of Manufacturers. He pleaded for fair play on the part of the operation and operative. He denounced Hearst, Bryan, Gompers, Schmitz and Ruef and continued: Trade unions are the autocrats who exist. Good employers and well behaved laborers must work in harmony. "An oppressive employer is the worse enemy to society than the demagogue he assails." He advocated an increase in wages, urged a manufacturer's share.
 Waller Drew, commissioner of the National Directors Association told the Industrial Association that "The open shop and industrial crime brot the work to a stand still. The employer is to be centured. The blame is on all who stand by and watched the results of the closed shop."

INDEFENSIBLE ATTITUDE

 Washington, Dec. 4.—Senator Raynor, of Maryland, regards the President's attitude with reference to the Japanese as absolutely indefensible. such a threat as using force against the state as "outrageous and startling to the imagination." This afternoon he offered a senate resolution directing the President to notify all of the world, Japan included, that the states have the exclusive rights over schools. The resolution proposed, declares that it is the opinion of the senate that there is no provision in the treaty with Japan in reference to the subject or interferes with the right of the state of California to conduct a system of schools in accordance with its own legislation. Raynor will speak on the subject tomorrow. The resolution was laid on the table and the senate adjourned.
 Senator Tillman left before the reading of the message began. Other Southern senators gave rapt attention to the discussion of the race problem and the denunciation of the mob law. Senators Platt and Depew paid little attention but conversed and laughed jovially occasionally. Speaker Cannon today appointed Cousins of Iowa to succeed Hitt as chairman of foreign affairs.
