# BRIGHT OUTLOOK FOR WESTERN SILVER MINES

(Scripps News Association) Denver, Colo., Dec. 7.—Director of United States Mints George E. Roberts is here today looking after some silver mining properties on behalf of the government. It appears as if Colorado would come into her own again, as the greatest silver producing state in the world, as all the silver mines are to be reopened even in the low paying districts. It looks as if the government will force the price of silver as high as 85 cents an ounce before January next. Not only this country but Mexico and India are crying for silver. Mexico needs silver so badly that the United States government has been engaged to stamp several million dollars worth of pesos at top speed in the San Francisco mint. India, becoming aware of the rise, refuses to sell her silver at

present to the United States. Four years ago, during the great panic, silver crept down and down day by day and when it reached 56 cents the industry went to pieces. The low water mark was reached in December 1902 when the white metal went to 47.1 cents an ounce. At present the whole country is crying for silver and the movement of the United States government in purchasing minas has caused London to make heavy purchases of silver. Money is needed badly, and as the comparatively few silver dollars in this country are kept in the government vaults while the silver certificates, which cover them, are kept in circulation, it is possible that silver will be coined in such immense quantities from now on as to justify the revival of the silver mining industry on a large scale in Colorado.

London, Dec. 7.—A Blue Book issued today shows the total number of coal mines in operation in India to be 276 compared with 294 in 1904. The total output last year was 8,410,739 tons of which 7,254,355 tons were produced in the province of Bengal. The average number of persons working in the mines is given as 87,995 of whom 61,602 are adult males and 29,556 children under 12 years of age.
