ORDINANCE ON. 346.

Series 1905

An ordinance relating to the use of streets for building purposes and the removal of buildings.

The City of La Grande does Ordain as follows:—

SECTION 1. No person or persons shall occupy any portion of any street or sidewalk for the deposit of building material, or for the construction or repair of any building, or for the removal of any buildings, without first obtaining a permit therefor as herein provided.

SECTION 2. Applications for permits shall be in writing, and shall specify if for building purposes, the name of the streets where located, the number of the lot and block, the size and description of the building to be constructed; or if to be repaired, the character of the repairs, the space in front of the lot or lots needed, and proposed time for completing the work; materials to be used; the name of the owner; and the estimated cost of such building or repairs, as the case may be. For the removal of a building or buildings, the application shall state the number of the lot and block upon which the same is located, the size of the building, the number of the lot and block to which it is proposed to remove the same, the route to be taken, and the length of time required for such removal; the nature of the repairs thereto or alterations therein, if any; the estimated cost thereof; the name of the owner and the name of the street or streets where the same is to be removed to.

SECTION 3. Permits shall be issued by the City Recorder upon the approval, endorsed upon the application, of the Committee on Streets. A record thereof, shall be kept by the City Recorder setting forth in a concise manner the description of the property, name of owner, cost of the building, and the objects for which the permit was granted. He shall immediately upon granting such permit, notify the Street Superintendent of its contents, and the use of a street or streets under such permit shall be under the supervision of the Street Superintendent. No permit shall be issued for a longer period than 90 days.

SECTION 4. The application for such permit for building purposes shall state the width of that portion of the street proposed to be used, and the number of days for which the use of said street will be needed in the construction of said building. Whenever the recipient of a building permit shall desire to occupy or in any wise obstruct more than one half the width of the sidewalk or street in front of such proposed building, it shall be the duty of each recipient of such building permit to erect and maintain during all the time covered by such permit, a safe and substantial board fence not less than four feet high along the curb line of the sidewalk in front of and across the sidewalk at each end of the tract, lot or part thereof, upon which such building is to be constructed, and also to construct and maintain and keep unobstructed and well lighted a safe and substantial plank sidewalk three feet wide along the curb line in front of such proposed building, and extending three feet into the wagon way, and reach three feet beyond each end of such fence along said curb line; and the issuing of a permit shall not be construed as authorizing any person to in any wise obstruct the footwalk hereinbefore described; Provided, that as soon as the first story walls of such building shall have been erected, the parties or party taking out such permit shall construct a substantial and well lighted covered way over the sidewalk in front of such tract or lot, leaving such sidewalk open for public use, and thereupon such party shall be entitled to a permit for the use of such portions of the street or streets as may not interfere with existing rights, and subject to such limitations and requirements as may be stated in such permit, and such footwalk as herein provided shall thereafter be removed from the roadway. Upon application for permit for the removal of a building or buildings the same shall state the route and mode of such removal, and the number of days for which the permit shall be applied, and together with an endorsement thereon by the Street Committee of such restrictions as the public interest may require. The Street Committee may at its discretion require applications for permits to give security by deposit or otherwise and any damages that may occur by carelessness or failure to comply with the provisions of this ordinance, and no permit shall be issued unless the application therefor is accompanied by a fee of \$2.50 for a permit to use the streets for the deposit of building material, and not less than \$2.50 for the use of a street or streets for the removal of any building; provided, that the provisions of this ordinance shall in no manner authorize the construction or removal of a building within the fire limits of the city of La Grande, unless all the requirements establishing such fire limits have been fully complied with by the applicant or applicants for such permit.

SECTION 5. The removal of a building or building under a permit, when commenced shall be continuous during all the hours of the day, and day by day, Sunday excepted, until completed, with the least possible obstruction to the thoroughfares occupied. No building shall be allowed to remain over night upon any street crossing or intersection or so near thereto as to prevent easy access to any fire hydrant or system. Lighted lanterns shall be kept in a conspicuous place at each end of such buildings during the hours in which the street lamps are lighted or required to be lighted.

SECTION 6. Upon the expiration of the time named in the permit or as near the use of the street or streets are no longer necessary, the street or streets shall be cleared of all obstructions by the holder of such permit, and placed in as good repair by such holder as when such permit was granted.

SECTION 7. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, upon conviction thereof before the City Recorder shall be punished by a fine not less than \$5 nor more than \$25, and each day of maintaining and continuing such violation shall be deemed a separate offense and punished accordingly.

SECTION 8. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the 15th day of December, 1906, and shall be published in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer.

Passed by the Council of the city of La Grande, on the 5 day of December, 1906, by 5 members voting therefor, and no members voting against the same.
Approved by the Mayor, this 5 day of December, 1906.
