FUNDS FOR RUSSIAN PEASANTS

(Scripps News Association)

London, Dec 15.—At a great meeting of Philanthropists in the Exeter Hall tonight under the presidency of Lord Rothschild, Mr. Israel Zangwill, chief of the Zionist movement, declared that death threatened no less than 20,000,000 Russian peasants during the coming winter, unless something was quickly done.

Very little was being done, he said, by the Russian Government to alleviate the sufferings of the peasants and it is believed Jews in all parts of the world to come to the immediate assistance of the downtrodden and starving brethren.

It was announced that half a million pounds had already been subscribed and Lord Rothschild estimates that in the course of a few weeks, \$5,000,000 would be forwarded to the committee in Russia for distribution.

WALLOWA COUNTY

Enterprise, Ore., Dec. 15.—A summary of the Wallowa county assessment roll for 1906 shows there are 8,331 horses, valued at \$306,895; 25,479 cattle, valued at \$430,170; 171,968 sheep, valued at \$515,880; 8,990 hogs, valued at \$28,320. The value of the tillable land in the county is \$1,480,450; improvements thereon, \$625,575. There are 45½ miles of telephone, valued at \$5,665. The total value of all taxable property is \$5,617,900.
