Good Roads Convention tomorrow and next day.

The various churches are preparing for exceptionally good Christmas exercises this year.

A much desired white Christmas seems to be our good fortune this year from the present weather indications.

The financial condition of our citizens as a whole, this year are better than usual for enjoying Christmas festivities. In other words there is more money in circulation.

President Roosevelt certainly plays chess with his cabinet. They will understand thoroughly the workings of the different departments. However the personnel of the President's advisors are men of integrity and action.

Voting machines have been hailed as the only accurate means by which votes could be cast and counted without fraud. but in New York the Democrats made a complaint about the vote as announced from a machine, which was taken into court and examined, when it was found that the Democratic lever had been so plugged that it could be pushed down the same as the other levers, but would not register. Our annual school election for the purpose of levying the required tax for the maintenance of our public schools, of which we have just reason to be proud will take place on December 28th. The tax levy last year was nine mills. Whether or not this should be raised or is sufficient will undoubtedly be presented at the meeting.

Five of the women suffragists who caused so much trouble at the recent convening of the English parliament, have been fined \$5 and cost. Just to show that they are worthy the ballot as well as the men, they propose to serve out the fine in jail.

Emperor William of Germany and President Roosevelt of the United States must have fed upon the same milk. Both have no hesitancy in expressing themselves in an emphatic manner when occasion demands. The German parliament the reichstag, refused to vote an appropriation to maintain an army in South Africa large enough to suit the emperor, who is quoted as saying: "This is a fine sort of government; I will scatter the whole tribe to the four winds." He thereupon surprised the whole of Germany, who thought that he would not dare do such a thing; by dissolving the whole parliament, and has ordered another election.
