Every advanced movement requires more or less public agitation and all who attended the Good Roads Convention now in session in this city cannot help but see the importance and direct benefits that will follow this meeting.

Friday night the school board is expected to meet and prepare an estimate of expenses upon which to form a basis for the tax levy and it is expected the election of a director to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Judge Eakin.

We have been informed that further action relative to our proposed new city charter will have to be postponed until the legislature meets and ratifies the law under which it is to be referred to the people. Pendleton we understand is in a similar condition. It only means a delay of a few months and as we have reached our present high development under our present charter, we certainly can wait a little longer.

While the question of good roads is paramount at this time it is noticeable what little interest generally is taken in the matter by the businessmen. Every merchant in this county is loser to a much greater degree that possibly many of them realize and the poor condition of our roads is responsible in a great measure for much of the trade that is sent away to the large mail order houses. These houses receive many small orders, which in the aggregate runs into thousands of dollars during the year, from the fact that it is easier to sit by the side of a warm fire and make out their orders and have the free rural delivery bring the package to their doors than it is for them to hitch up a team and travel several miles thru an almost impassible lollily. In the older eastern states that enjoy miles of macadamized road, it is noticeable that on rainy days when the farm work cannot be followed, the roads are lined with buggies filled with farmers going to town not altogether to buy supplies but to have a day as it were. Over such roads they can spin along just as well during the rainy season as is possible in the summer.
