HANGED YESTERDAY

Houston, Mo., Dec. 22.—Joda Hamilton, the youth who was convicted of killing the Parsons family on October 12, was hanged today. The largest crowd that has ever assembled in this city attended the execution.
The murderer had quarreled with Carrie Parson over an old saddle. The dispute grew heated, and Hamilton shot Parsons, then killed Mrs. Parsons with an axe. Three sons with ages of five, three and one years, crawled into some bushes during the frightful moments but the frenzied man dragged them out one by one and cut their throats. He then piled all the bodies into the wagon in which Parsons family was making a pilgrimage to the old home in Illinois, drove to a creek and dumped them in. Young Hamilton, later, was at the church with his fiancée when he heard that the bodies had been found in the milldam. He kissed her goodbye, fled on one of Parsons' mules but was captured soon after.

MORMONS REVERE A PROPHET

Salt Lake City, Utah, Dec. 22.—Wherever there are Mormons there will be celebration tomorrow and the festivities will entirely take the place of the celebration three days hence by Christendom. There will be no trees or gifts but at the exercises in the meeting houses the children will be told the story of Smith's birth in 1805, in a small farm house in Sharon Windsor county, Vermont, and of his alleged discovery of the sacred plates, his subsequent revelations, his founding of the Mormon religion and his tragic death in Illinois.

INCREASED COST OF LIVING

Boston, Dec. 22.—Statistics prepared by a well known expert, will be published in pamphlet form to-morrow showing the cause and effect of increased cost of living. The price of food is now calculated to be much higher than at any time since 1884.
