AMERICA'S FIRST TEA CROP

Charleston, Dec. 22—The marketing of America's first tea crop is now in full swing no less than twelve thousand pounds having been grown on a plantation in Colleton County a few miles from here. Tea has been grown in Penhurst, at the Government experimental garden for the past two years at Summarville but the product marketed now is the first of a purely commercial venture. It is expected that next year's output will be very large as tea is to be grown on a very large number of plantations.
