BARRETT ADDRESSES STUDENTS

University of Oregon, Dec. 21, 1906. Hon. John Barrett, who has recently been requested to assume the direction of the Bureau of American Republics, spoke at Assembly Wednesday. He gave a graphic picture of the resources of the twelve South American republics. Brazil he said, is larger than the U. S. The Amazon drains a valley five times as big as does the Mississippi. Great ships ascend it more than 1000 miles. Its capital has 1,000,000 people, spends more on civic improvement than does New York. Buenos Ayres has 1,100,000 people, has solved municipal ownership, has free doctors and lawyers for the poor, has a newspaper building costing \$5,000,000, an opera house worth \$6,000,000, has streets as clean as a floor, while Argentina will next year export more wheat than the U. S. Mr. Barrett told also of the other great Latin republics. He asserted that there are less divorces in South America in ten years than in Chicago in six months. Then he told of his recent mission in Columbia, reconciling that republic for the loss of Panama. Finally he spoke of the canal zone, comparing present and former conditions there. He closed with a statement of the commercial value of South America to the U. S., and the assertion that the Latin republics look to Uncle Sam as a model and should be so treated that they may say:—"Big Brother we trust in you."

Mr. Barrett speaks in a most entertaining fashion. After assembly he met many of the students informally.

MELBA SAILS FOR AMERICA

Her autumn season of Italian Opera at Convent Garden was the most successful during her career. Interviewed before sailing she announced that she was in capital voice and anticipated that her appearance in America would be a success.

WHEAT CROP FOR THE ORIENT

Orders are being daily received and the new trade promises to assume immense proportions. Owing to the failure of the Black Sea crop in southern Russia grain is also being shipped from here to England. The Iverna left today with 2500 tons of wheat for Liverpool.
