## LAND MARK OF CIVIL WAR TIMES DOOMED

Washington, Dec. 24.—The historic "Long Bridge" over the Potomac has been torn down and not a trace of it now remains. It was built under an authority of Act of Congress, which appropriated \$100,000 for the purpose, and was open for traffic on May 20, 1809. When the British forces under General Ross and Admiral Cockburn captured Washington and a British fleet had Alexandria, Va., at its mercy, in August 1814, the bridge was

set on fire and partly destroyed to prevent a junction of British expeditions. The first Union troops sent to the south passed over Long Bridge in 1861 and at the close of the war the Army of the Potomac, under General Meade, and the Army of Tennessee, under General Sherman, returned over it to Washington. After the first battle of Bull Run the Union troops retreated across the bridge to seek safety in the capital. Two splendid modern structures have been built to replace the old bridge.

## OFFERS TO SELL BRAINS BLOOD AND BODY FOR CASH
