# MUST PAY DUTY ON RADIUM

(Scripps News Association)  
Washington, Dec 29—It has at length been decided that radium must be taxed. The classification to be accorded it under the Dingley Tariff Act is proving a difficult problem for New York Customs Officials as the mysterious product was unknown in 1897, when the tariff act was enacted. The Board of United States General Appraisers tried to solve the problem by charging it at the rate of 25 per cent., ad valorem, as a chemical salt but the importer objected to this and contended that it should be classed as ether and unenumerated manufactured

article, at 10 per cent., the highest. After consulting many authorities, General Appraiser Wilbur F. Lunt gives an opinion as follows:  
The merchandise is radium Bromide. From a large quantity of pitch blende, by an intricate mechanical and chemical process, a very minute quantity of radium is extracted which is then treated with bromide, resulting in the product radium bromide, which we find to be a chemical salt and correctly entered and assessed as such. The protest is over ruled.

# OREGON TO HAVE CANNERY

Freewater, Oregon, Dec 29—All arrangements were completed here today for the formation of a fruit and vegetable canning company which will commence operations early next season. The plant

of the new company will have a capacity of 30,000 cans per day. It is estimated that in this district last year over 50,000 bushels of tomatoes alone went to waste owing to lack of preserving facilities.

# CHARGE BRITISH OFFICIALS
