Mr. Jesse Hale, who plays the Indian, Washtah, in "At Cripple Creek", has had a picturesque and varied career. Born upon his father's schooner during a terrific gale on Lake Erie, Hale seemed fated for a gloomy existence; and his life voyage has so far been streaked with adventure and experiences that do not fall to the lot of the average stay-at-home person. He served one term in the Arizona Legislature, and for a time officiated as Secretary to the Governor. When the Spanish-American war broke out, the late Capt. "Buckey" O'Neill whose heroic death while leading a charge up San Juan Hill thrilled the hearts of newspaper readers, and whose last words, "Who wouldn't die for another star in the flag?" deserved to be cherished along with final utterances of the distinguished dead, sent Hale a telegraphic request to organize a regiment of Rough Riders in his town. He was connected with stock companies on the Atlantic coast for two seasons, and is versatile to a degree. He is especially well equipped in voice and temperament for the legitimate drama, having been highly commended in such parts as "Antonio" in "The Merchant of Venice," "Mercutio and Tybalt" in "Romeo and Juliet," "Casca" in "Julius Caesar", etc. Last season he played "Malatesta" in Whitney's revival of "Francesca da Rimini." that the design for a dam gotten up by your City Engineer be accepted, only that a core be constructed inside the rock-filled dam either of puddle clay or reinforced concrete.

This will assure the tightness of the dam in a more satisfactory way than earth covering alone and the additional expense is only small.

Prices of wood stave pipe include laying in the ditch. Prices of Kalame in pipe are f. o. b. La Grande.

You will notice that our estimate for the total cost of water main is \$142,526 with an 8 inch pipe for the lower part and \$154,526 with a 10 inch pipe.

While the itemized costs as put down in our estimate may be changed, a small amount up or down, by going further into detail, we think that the total cost as stated is a safe and conservative estimate upon which to base your bond issue.

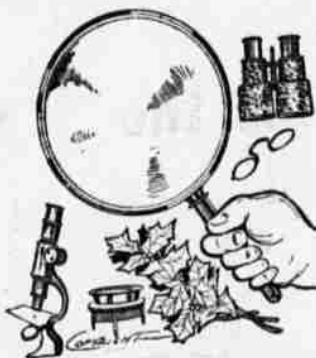

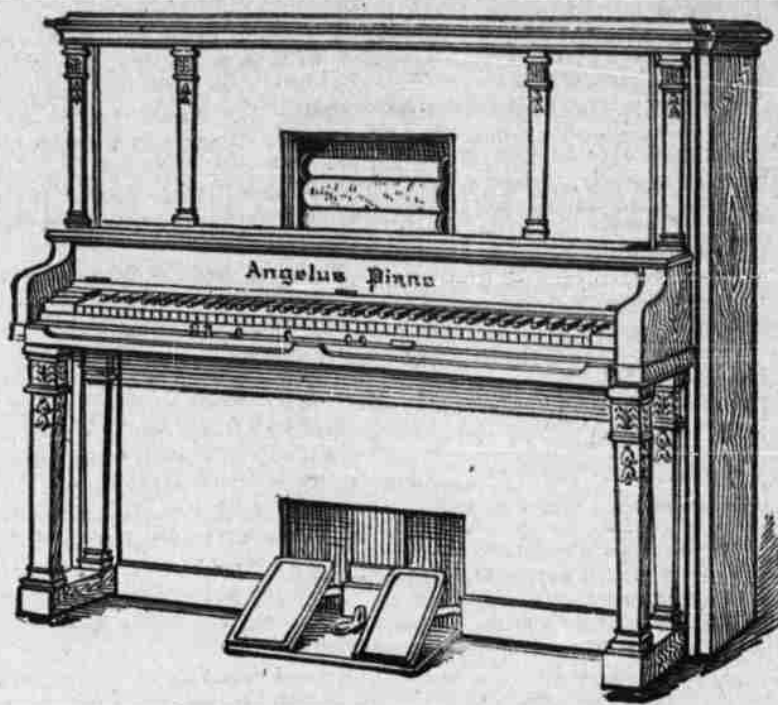
