GOLD FROM CANADA

(Scripps News Association)
New York, Jan. 8.—Over \$5,000,000
in gold have been received from Canada
during the past ten days and a consignment
of \$1,500,000 is expected today.
Speculation is now rife as to the proba-
bility of imports from Europe. Australia
and other sources as a pinch of money is
expected here this month. International
banking houses believe that London will
be called upon to forward large sums of
money this week to Brazil, Argentina and
Egypt, but point out that the absorption
of New York financial interests from
drawing on London for gold at the pres-
ent time will enable that centre to for-
tify itself by the gradual return flow
of a large amount of money from the
English provinces, or as it would be
termed in this country, from the interior
banks throughout England and Scotland.
It is confidently hoped, however, that Sec-
retary of the Treasury Shaw will come to
the relief of the money market should ex-
treme stringency develop which is not at
all unlikely.

CELEBRATING HISTORIC BATTLE

New Orleans, Jan. 8.—The city, state
and national flags are flying over the City
Hall today in commemoration of the ninety
first anniversary of the battle of New
Orleans, which occurred on January 8,
1815, when General Andrew Jackson
afterwards president of the United States,
routed the British army at New Orleans.
The day is a legal holiday in the state of
Louisiana and several patriotic societies
will banquet tonight.

on the theme "Seeking the Lost."

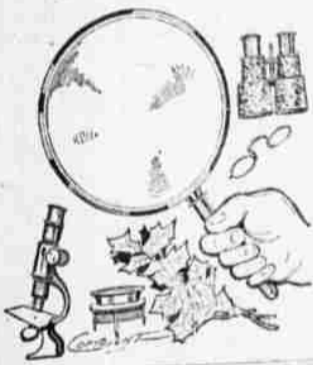
He spoke of how it was the mission of

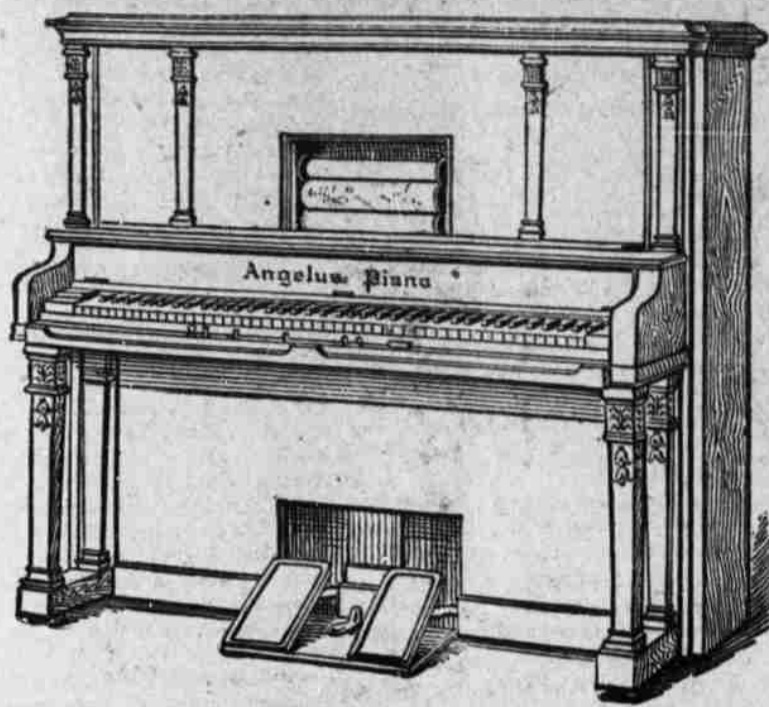
