EVANGELIZE THE WORLD IN 25 YEARS

(Scripture News Association)

Philadelphia, Jan. 9.—Plans to evangelize
the world in twenty-five years or at
the longest, within a generation, are being
discussed at the thirteenth annual
conference of the Mission boards in the
Y M C A building here today. The
movement was originally inaugurated by
some of the most influential laymen representing
all protestant denominations and several
millionaires have come forward to help in
the gigantic task.

Amongst those who spoke on the subject
today were Samuel Copen of Boston
John S. Huyler and William Schieffelin of
New York; Joshua Levering of Baltimore
John Foster of Washington; Major A. P.
Burchfield of Pittsburg; N. W. Harris of
Chicago; Bishop Baskford of China and
ex-governor Beaver of Bellefonte Pa.
It was announced by Bishop Baskford
that investigations in foreign lands would
be made by a commission of fifty or more
wealthy laymen who will devote a portion
of their time this year while traveling to
the business of Christianity. The work
already accomplished in foreign mission
fields will be fully investigated during this
year and the work greatly extended. The
movement has been organized as a result
of the centennial anniversary of the
Haystack Prayer meeting held in the
Fifth Avenue Church, New York in November.

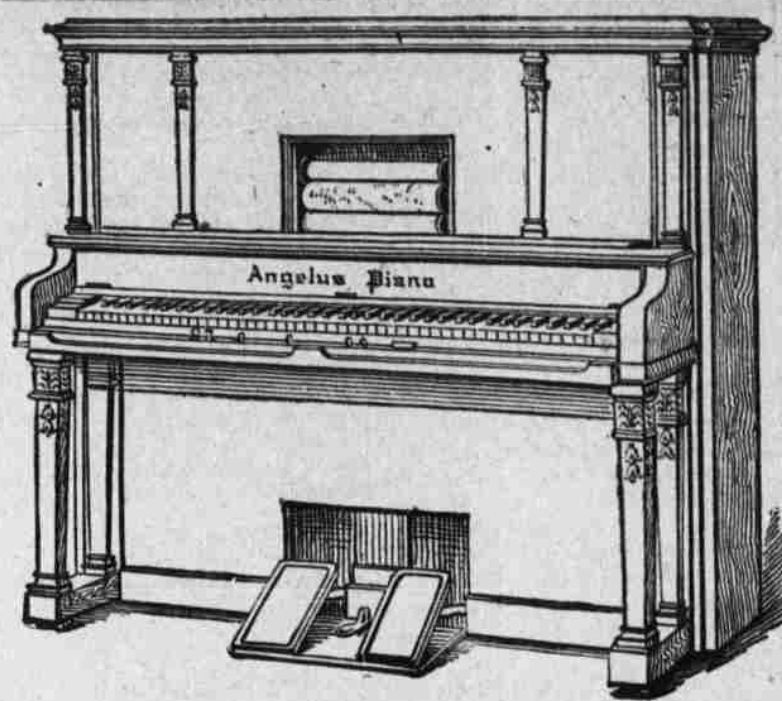
COMPANY ATTACHED AGAIN

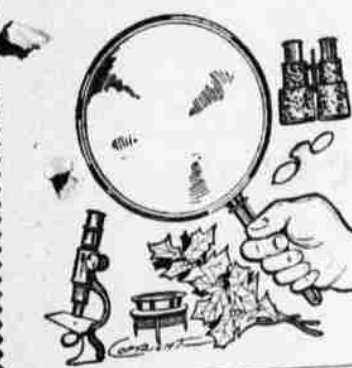
