#### EMIGRATION FROM SPAIN

(Berthel News Association)  
Madrid, Jan 15—The Anchor Line Steamship Scotia sailed from here today with two thousand emigrants from Bojar and Salamanca for Uruguay and Nicaragua. This makes over twelve thousand emigrants from the districts mentioned for the past month. They are leaving this country to escape the poverty owing to the closing down of a large number of cloth factories which could not compete with British and German manufacturers. The governments of Uruguay and Nicaragua offered them free passages and will advance their capital to build factories.

#### ARMOUR'S NEW PLANT

Minneapolis, Minn., Jan. 15—The Armour Packing Co. today commenced the construction of a large car chop plant here which will cost \$5,000,000. Altogether the company will spend about \$6,000,000 in construction work in this city next summer.
