**CRAWFORD AWARDED HIS CLAIM**

By the terms of an order issued by Judge Smit yesterday afternoon Judge T H Crawford was given a judgement for \$20,000 which he claimed against the Highland Gold Mines company for services rendered and upon the assignment of a claim for money advanced by the vice president of the concern to pay its debts and is now virtually in control of the property.

Judge Crawford will proceed to immediately redeem the property which was sold recently at sheriff's sale unless the company itself, which is likely to be re-organized, redeems it. In that case he will be ready to give the property to the shareholders as soon as they can make arrangements to reimburse him, and pay the judgment which he now holds on the property. The receiver, Otto Harlocker has been discharged.

Judge Crawford's judgement covers his claim for attorneys fees, of about \$5000 W F Butcher's claim for attorneys fees, \$1800 and about \$6000 put up for the company by E B Deihl, its vice president.

It is the intention of the company to proceed to a re-organization and take the property out of Judge Crawford's hands as soon as possible. The new directors will meet today to elect officers and proceed with the work of reorganization.—Baker City Herald.

The meeting will continue all next week.

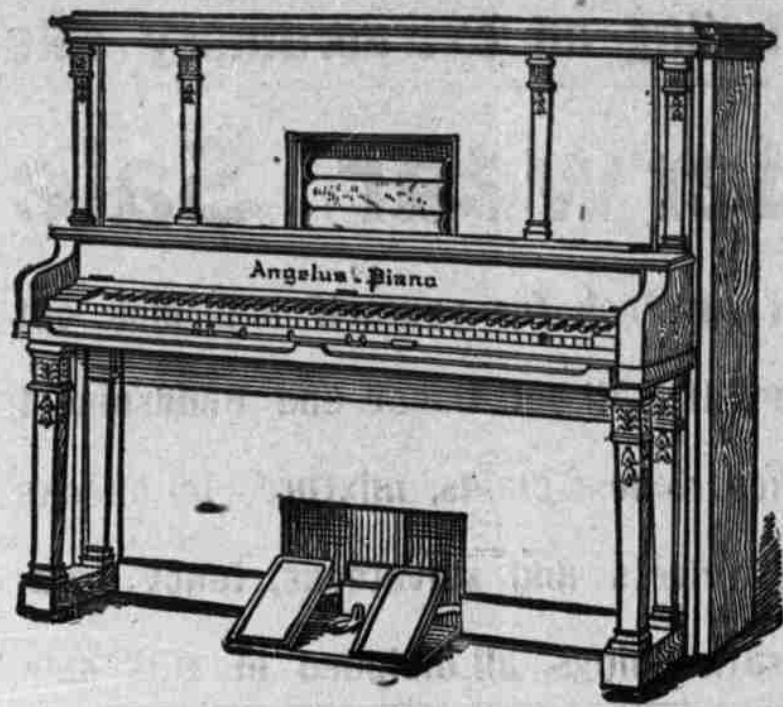
