La Grande is undergoing a municipal  
house cleaning almost as complete as the  
one carried on some time ago in St. Louis  
by Joe Folk, according to the statement  
of J. W. Knowles, an attorney of the Union  
county's capital, who was in Portland yes-  
terday on his way to Salem to argue a  
case before the Oregon supreme court.  
Two councilmen of La Grande are at  
present under indictment for an infringe-  
ment of the county laws. The mayor was  
arrested a few days ago for violating the  
quarantine ordinances and the marshal  
was acquitted yesterday of a charge of  
using profane language while arresting  
aman for using profane language.

vindication. Otherwise La Grande is quite

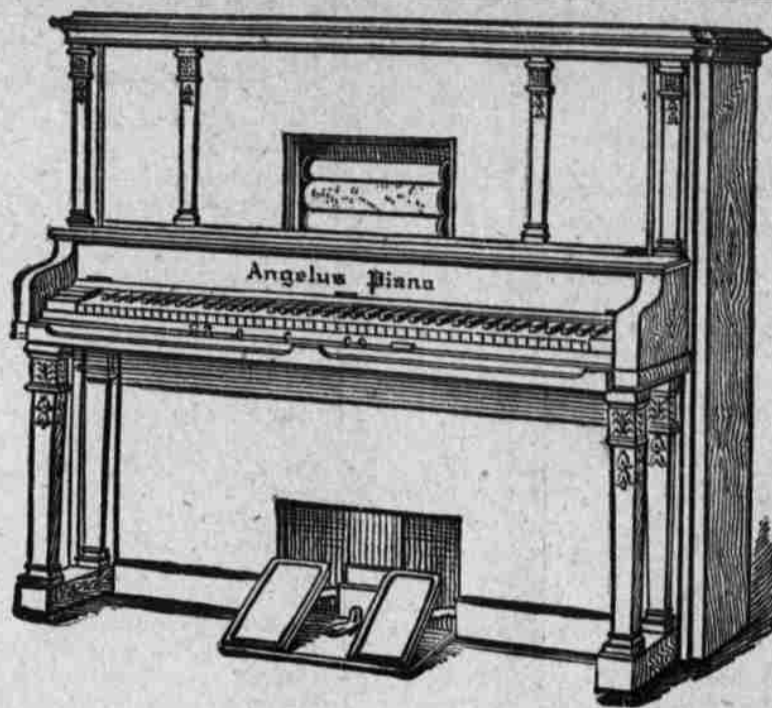
