Late last evening, the most sensational instance in the trial so far, occurred when arrest of Rollie Brown. Brown had been on the stand and during the cross examination, the startling fact was elicited, and became the wife of Mr. J. L. testified on several matters, exactly as he knew it. Last night, when on the stand. he admitted to the cross examiner that his parents had advised him, and even ordered him to change his testimony when he appeared on the witness stand in th. trial. 
