"CARNATION DAY"

Washington, Jan. 29—As the carnation is said to have been President McKinley's favorite flower, thousands of Americans all the world over are today wearing it in honor of the anniversary of the late President's birthday. The Carnation League of America is now a strong organization much as the English have established a Primrose League in memory of Lord Viscountess. Carnations were worn by all members of the House of Representatives, Democrats and Republicans alike. Never before has the homage been so uniform. Employees of Congress and officials and clerks in the various executive departments all joined and the entire force of the White House appeared with the pink or carnation upon the lapel of each coat. During President McKinley's occupancy of the White House he daily wore his favorite flower.

WIDOW VISITS TOMB

Canton, Ohio, Jan. 29—Canton people informally, but generally observed McKinley's birthday. Special patriotic programs were held in most of the schools and the pink carnation was in evidence. Mrs. McKinley was driven to the cemetery in the afternoon with a large bunch of carnations for the tomb of the late president. A floral piece bearing the card of Geo. B. Cirtelyou was placed on the casket.

New York, Jan. 29—Carnation Day was observed here. The pink carnation was everywhere in evidence. Tonight the Union League will banquet at Delmonico's when speeches eulogistic of the late President McKinley will be delivered.
