CREGON OSTEOPATHS ASK FUR SQUARE DEAL

We beg to sall your attention to provistons of Senate Bill 69 and House Bill

First: An examining board to be appointed by the Governor, said board beng of no expense to the state.

Second: Preliminary education eque trouble, and there is a merry comedy of to high school diploma or college entrance examination, before examination for practice.

Third: Three years of nine mor each, college work and examination before Board in Anatomy, physiology, histology, pathology, chemistry, toxicology, diagminor surgery, principles and practice of Osteopathy.

Fourth: Licensing of Osteopaths already in the state.

Fifth: All Osteopaths are prohibited from giving drugs or practicing surgery. Sixth: As amended Section 10 provides that this act shall not be so construed as to interfere with or prevent the practice of or use of massage, Swedish movement, physical culture, or other natural methods requiring the use of the hand or hands, provided that each person or persons do not violate the provisions of Section 7 of this act or any part or parts of said Section.

We beg to call attention that this act is strictly to regulate the practice of Osteopathy and in no way interferes with any other method or system of treat-
