READY FOR THE PENROSE HEARING

(Scraps News Association)

San Antonio, Tex., Feb. 1.—According to present plans the court-martial called by Gen. McCaskey, commanding the Department of Texas, will convene at Fort Sam Houston on Monday next for the trial of Major C. W. Penrose and Capt. E. A. Macklin of the Twenty-fifth Infantry. The specific charges against the two officers are conduct to the prejudice of good order and discipline in failing to exercise due diligence in preventing rioting at Brownsville last August. Colonel George L. Brown, commanding the Twenty-sixth Infantry, is president of the court, and First Lieutenant Charles E. Hay, Jr., Twenty-fourth Infantry, acting judge advocate of the department of Texas, is judge advocate of the court. With one exception the court is composed of officers attached to the department of Texas. The exception is Major E. D. Hoyle, artillery corps, who was especially detailed by the chief of staff at Washington to complete the quota of the court. The court-martial proceedings will be of great interest, as they are expected to develop all the facts connected with the Brownsville raid and to settle beyond controversy whether colored troops took part in it. The trials will be conducted in accordance with the laws and the regulations, and all witnesses will be sworn and be subject to cross-examination.
