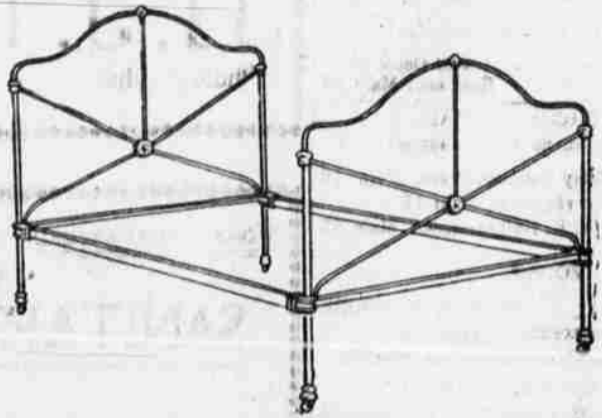

It is conceded that La Grande is going to grow rapidly this year and it is also a well known fact to accommodate this increase in population that many new homes will have to be constructed, for the reason that vacant houses at the present time are very scarce. The hammer and saw will be very much in evidence in La Grande during 1907.

Gambling is running wide open, women being permitted to sit at the gambling tables with the men, worse if possible than was Sumpter in her boom days. Circuit court will be in session next week, we will await results.

There is quite a number of state cases already on the docket but the major part of them are of the petty larceny variety. Union county is to be congratulated upon the fact that we have had no very expensive criminal cases for several years.

We understand that there is to be no grand jury at this term of circuit court. A good idea, this may save a lot of trouble. For the past two years these grand jurors all over the country have been the direct cause of more trouble than any other department, state or national.

The report of our public schools for the month of January show that only two rooms were visited by parents. This is not as it should be. We have a splendid school, we all know it, but at the same time parents are not treating the children nor the teachers properly.

It looks very much as tho the normal school at Weston is to be moved. If so, the three contesting points will be Pendleton, La Grande and Baker City. Here is a matter for the Commercial Club of this city to take up. When all of the natural conditions are considered with a view of securing the best location for a permanent normal school in Eastern Oregon, La Grande certainly is the place.

The purchase of the locks at Oregon City by the state will be of great benefit to the farmers of the Willamette valley. State aid towards opening of the Columbia, will help the farmers of Eastern Oregon. Mutual interests would suggest the legislators of the two interested sections would join forces in securing both projects.

It is just possible that before many years, the pulp from our sugar factory will be the basis of a denatured alcohol plant.

The library of our public school now contains over 900 volumes and this number will be increased very soon by 150 new volumes. The La Grande public school is getting better with each year.

There certainly is a splendid opportunity for quite a good sized packing house in La Grande. Wallowa and Union county annually produce a large number of hogs that could be cured and distributed from this point. Some one with the experience and a few thousand dollars will tackle it some of these days.
