OSTEOPATHS APPEALING

Osteopaths are making a strenuous effort to have the Legislature pass the bill introduced by Senator Nottingham, providing for the creation of a State Board of Osteopathic Examiners. From all parts of the state the Osteopaths are bringing pressure to bear on the solons to pass the law they have wanted so long.

The fact that the Nottingham bill was referred to the committee composed of practitioners of materia medica, caused the friends of the measure to charge that it had been cast among wolves, but it is believed that the interest taken in the matter by the osteopaths and their friends will be sufficient to bring about a favorable report.

The point for which the osteopaths are clamoring is the right to be judged by their own. Under the present system the only legally constituted official body before which they can go for an examination is the State Board of Medical Examiners, composed of practitioners of medicine, whereas the osteopaths do not practice medicine. Therefore, they claim that it is unfair to subject them to an examination along lines in which they do not believe and before a body of men hostile to their school.

In other words, the osteopaths want to be judged by a board made up of their own faith, for such a board, they contend is better able to pass upon the qualifications of the applicants and at the same time protect the public from quacks in the osteopathic line.

It is argued in favor of the bill that its passage will not entail a dollar of expense to the state, and at the same time give to a distinct and growing school of healing an official board by which it can raise the standard of its professional qualifications.—Telegram.
