# WILL USE OX TEAMS AT IMBLER

The day of the oxen is not past and the driver's "Haw" and "Gee" will still be heard in this valley. A man named Crookham, hailing from Idaho, has purchased timber holdings in the Imbler and Summersville vicinities and will build a sawmill in Imbler and to get the lumber to the mill he will resort to the ox rather than the horse.

His peculiar ultimatum, he says, was reached after careful consideration. It is much cheaper to purchase oxen, they can be maintained at less expense, and can do better service in "snaking" timber than can horses. About twenty yokes of oxen will be able to supply the timber which his mill of 50,000 feet capacity can saw.

The mill is to be built near the O. R. & N. in the town of Imbler. A planing mill will be a part of the plant. Steam is to be the motive power. The promoter hopes to be cutting early next season.

This industry will prove a drawing card for the inland town. At least seventy-five men will be employed there, and after studying the other small towns of the valley, Mr. Crookham feels confident that Imbler is the coming town of the valley.
